PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE BACHELOR OF SOCIAL WORK IN THE SCHOOL OF SOCIAL WORK CHAPTER IN THE UNDERGRADUATE CATALOG 2016-2018

Dean Luis H. Zayas, in the School of Social Work has filed with the secretary of the Faculty Council the following changes to the *Undergraduate Catalog*, 2016-2018. The secretary has classified this proposal as legislation of *general* interest to more than one college or school.

The Committee on Undergraduate Degree Program Review recommended approval of the changes on January 20, 2016, and forwarded the proposal to the Office of the General Faculty. The Faculty Council has the authority to approve this legislation on behalf of the General Faculty. The authority to grant final approval on this legislation resides with UT System with notification to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

If no objection is filed with the Office of the General Faculty by the date specified below, the legislation will be held to have been approved by the Faculty Council. If an objection is filed within the prescribed period, the legislation will be presented to the Faculty Council at its next meeting. The objection, with reasons, must be signed by a member of the Faculty Council.

To be counted, a protest must be received in the Office of the General Faculty by February 14, 2016.

2.	 EXPLAIN CHANGE TO DEGREE PROGRAM AND GIVE A DETAILED RATIONALE FOR EACH INDIVIDUAL CHANGE: A. We are requesting that social work pre-majors be required to complete SW310 Introduction to Social Work and Social Welfare prior to the semester they apply to the major. Other course prerequisites for applying to the major may be taken during the semester students submit their application. Since our application to the major due dates fall on October 1 and March 1, without this requirement, students may only have five to six weeks of social work coursework before applying to the major. Given our highly sequenced courses, accreditation standards and professional expectations, our faculty did not feel this was sufficient preparation for students or faculty to assess students' academic readiness and professional goodness of fit for the social work profession. This situation has become increasingly problematic for internal and external transfer students. With the completion of SW310, students will have already successfully completed forty-five hours of service learning (a course requirement) and will have a grade for a completed social work course when they apply to the major which will enable both the students and social work faculty to better assess students' application to the major. B. We are proposing that HDF313 Child Development or PSY 304 Introduction to Child Psychology, one of our current course prerequisites for applying to the social work major, be deleted. This will simplify students' academic plans and reduce the number of hours to complete the social work degree from 125 to 122. C. We are also proposing that SW325 Foundations of Social Justice: Values, Diversity, Power and Oppression be changed from a social work major course, previously only open to students admitted to our major, to a course prerequisite for applying to the major. This change in course sequencing will allow this course to be taken by students pursuing our newly proposed social work minor.

2. The applicant must have completed the following courses with a grade of at least *C* in each course: Social Work 310, 312, 313, 318, and 325. either Human Development and Family Sciences 313 or Psychology 304. He or she must also have a grade point average of at least 2.50 in courses that are part of the social work major requirements. SW310 must be completed a semester before applying to the major.
