PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE AMERICAN STUDIES DEGREE PROGRAM IN THE COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS CHAPTER IN THE UNDERGRADUATE CATALOG, 2018-2020

Dean Randy Diehl in the College of Liberal Arts has filed with the Secretary of the Faculty Council the following proposal to change the American Studies degree program in the College of Liberal Arts chapter in the *Undergraduate Catalog*, 2018-2020. The American Studies Executive Committee approved the proposal on March 20, 2017; the College Curriculum Design and Assessment Committee approved it on April 5, 2017, and the Dean and the College faculty approved it on April 25, 2017. The Secretary has classified this proposal as legislation of exclusive interest to one college or school.

The Committee on Undergraduate Degree Program Review recommended approval of the proposal on October 17, 2017, and forwarded it to the Office of the General Faculty. The Faculty Council has the authority to approve this legislation on behalf of the General Faculty. The authority to grant final approval on this legislation resides with the Provost on behalf of the President.

If no objection is filed with the Office of the General Faculty by the date specified below, the legislation will be held to have been approved by the Faculty Council. If an objection is filed within the prescribed period, the legislation will be presented to the Faculty Council at its next meeting. The objection, with reasons, must be signed by a member of the Faculty Council.

To be counted, a protest must be received in the Office of the General Faculty by October 29, 2017.

Major

<u>Twenty-seven</u> [27] semester hours of coursework in American studies, including at least <u>fifteen</u> [15] hours of upper-division coursework. The following courses are required:

- American Studies 311S, Introductory Seminar in American Studies
- American Studies 355, Main Currents of American Culture to 1865 and American Studies 356, Main Currents of American Culture since 1865
- Nine semester hours chosen from topics of American Studies 370, Seminar in American Culture
- [• Six additional semester hours of American studies coursework] Three additional hours of American studies coursework
- LA 320-WB or three additional hours of American studies coursework
